### Foundations

Foundations courses meet the needs of both high school students and transitioning middle school students who are not prepared for grade-level academic challenges. Foundations courses develop skills and strategies in math, reading, and writing with the goal of raising achievement to a high school level. #### Honors

With many opportunities to apply, extend, and synthesize knowledge, Honors courses are ideally suited to prepare students for the rigors of AP courses. ### Advanced Placement
